RE: COVID-19 and Animation Guild Members Working From Home

Dear Labor Relations Contacts from our Partner Studios,

As we are all aware, COVID-19 has been declared a pandemic by the World Health Organization. The spread of the virus in the United States has proven difficult to track due to the lack of test kits, but globally we are seeing reports that the virus may spread quickly through a community. According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, the "spread from person-to-person is most likely among close contacts (about 6 feet). Person-to-person spread is thought to occur mainly via respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes, similar to how influenza and other respiratory pathogens spread."

Countries are closing their borders to prevent the virus from spreading. Both the California Governor and Los Angeles Mayor have encouraged the closure of venues and spaces that accommodate groups of as few as 50 people. Theme parks, concerts, sporting events, and conventions have decided to put the well-being of their participants ahead of their events and profits.

Our mutual interests have always found us balancing the needs of our membership with your needs to produce animated content. During our triennial discussions over our collective agreement, we have agreed that the safety of our members is of paramount importance to both of us.
